The recent reforms to the further education/learning and skills sector have brought in changes to enable all tutors in adult and community learning to achieve professional status by gaining a licence to practise in recognition of their professionalism. A mandatory element of the process for gaining a licence is evidencing your personal literacy and numeracy skills to a minimum of level 2.

Standards Verification UK hosts the lists of approved qualifications for evidencing your literacy and numeracy skills.
